

CREATION OF A SENIOR RESIDENT CONSERVATION PATRON LICENSE

WHEREAS, the state of Wisconsin offered such a license previously; and,

WHEREAS, residents over 65 receive a discount on fishing and small game licenses if purchased separately but not if they buy the current conservation patron license; and,

WHEREAS, if such a license were to be offered it would give the DNR a larger revenue stream from a single license purchase rather than multiple smaller ones; and,

WHEREAS, Assembly Committee on Natural Resources and Sporting Heritage chair Rep. Al Ott R-Forest Junction is in favor of creating such a license (see enclosed article):

BE IT RESOLVED that the Wisconsin Wildlife Federation, assembled in the City of Wisconsin Rapids, Wisconsin this 11th day of April, 2015 pursue creation of a senior conservation patron license through the appropriate channels of the DNR, the Natural Resources Board and the State Assembly.
